CHANCE THEATER'S ANNUAL GALA

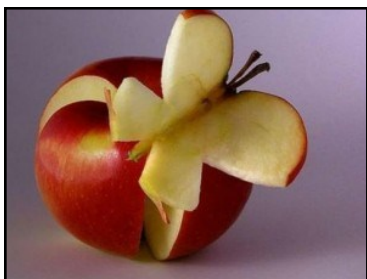

The First Presbyterian Church is looking for artists and

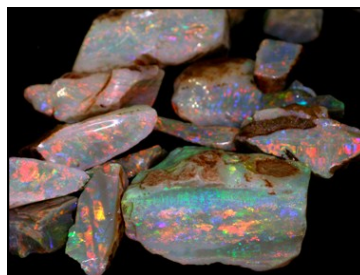
