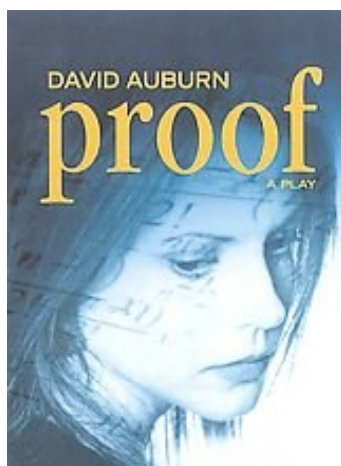


“THE GOAT OR WHO IS SYLVIA” AT THE CHANCE
